# MATCH SECRETARY'S NOTES

With thanks to the Army, the NHS folks and the many thousands of volunteers, the vaccination programme seems to be progressing at a pace hardly imagined possible a few weeks ago. Largely because of this, currently there is genuine optimism that we might be returning to some form of normality in the coming months.

Doubtless problems will emerge, especially in the early weeks of our playing season. Because of this, and feeling that our Spring Meeting at Burford in April, might be precariously timed, I have taken the precautionary step of booking a back-up date in May, in case we have to postpone the original.

I have attached the full, and updated, 2021 golfing calendar to the rear of this Newsletter. Apart from the provisional Spring Meeting date, there are also a couple of date changes that you might need to note for your own personal diaries.

To avoid any possibility of future confusion, please delete/destroy earlier copies of the 2021 golfing calendar.

### 1. THE WINTER LUNCH

Unfortunately, it is just about certain that the lunch will have to be cancelled. The earliest cessation of lock-down, and even then, only partial, seems to be mid-March and, even if internal gatherings were to be permitted, most golf clubs (including the Wychwood) have, in one way or another, laid off all their catering staff.

It may be appropriate for you to assume that the lunch will be cancelled, unless you hear again from us to the contrary.

## 2. THE CORNWALL TOUR 2021

Obviously, this trip will depend totally on the stage we've reached in fighting the pandemic, but it would be foolish to plan nothing, and then find in May that we could have gone ahead. If further cancellation becomes necessary, nothing is lost, other than my administrative time.

Therefore, arrangements for the Cornwall tour in May are in full swing. We have 34 Captains committed to the trip, from Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> to Thursday, 20<sup>th</sup> May, and all the reserved hotel rooms have been taken up. However, if we are quick, the hotel is holding a few more rooms in case we have any late-comers.

The three matches in May will be played on the golf courses at Looe, St Austell and Carlyon Bay, so should you know of anyone who might like to travel with us, please put them in touch with me.

#### 3. AVAILABILITY RETURNS FOR COUNTY MATCHES AND EVENTS

We will have to begin the team selection process in the coming weeks, therefore, if you haven't already done so, please now get your returns back to me now, as a matter of some urgency, at roger.sillence@live.co.uk.

I think it will be a question of taking one small step at a time, certainly into the early part of the summer, so please put aside any reservations you have now, make your selections and return the form to me as soon as you are able. It will be much easier, especially for me, if you drop out later, than to try and fit you in at the last minute!

Another incentive might be that nearly all of our active members are in credit from last year, not only for matches, events and the knock-out trophy, but also (for those involved) for the Cornish and Captain's tours; so, it will cost you nothing now to get involved!

#### 4. OGC INTERNAL EVENTS

Spread between the five fixtures (Captain's and President's Days, and the Spring, Autumn and Mixed Greensomes events), your availability returns are already predicting that we will have more than 225 entries. All of these days will entail visits to great golf courses, in superb company (?) so let's just hope this wretched pandemic permits us to play!

You will all be receiving the usual invitations to participate much nearer to the dates of these events,

## 5. THE PAIRS KNOCK-OUT

This newest of all our events, until last year's Covid-19 interruption, had quickly become a roaring success in a very short space of time, with the numbers of entrants increasing year-on-year.

We really do hope to run the event again this season, but think that it would be prudent to wait to see what happens when courses are re-opened, and then make a decision at that point.

One obstacle that is very likely to affect all our golf, at least initially this year, is that clubs, understandably, may well be wishing to protect their members' playing rights on their re-opening; readers will recall that most clubs did not admit visitors upon re-opening last year after the previous lock-down.

Our thinking is that we would only want to undertake the competition if everyone who wants to play, has the opportunity to do so.

Your Committee will make the decision, whether or not to play the knock-out, when the picture becomes clearer and you will, of course, be kept informed.

# 6. THE CAPTAIN'S TOUR - Monday 6th to Wednesday, 8th September 2021
